A screening mammogram is a routine exam for women who have no sign or symptoms of breast disease. It uses X-ray to make an image of the breast. The goal of a screening mammogram is to identify breast abnormalities as early as possible. If breast cancer is found early, there are more treatment options and a better chance for survival. Virginia Mason Franciscan Health advises women to get screening mammograms every year starting at age 40.*
